the credit of this province, they have utterly failed. The British loan has been quoted at 104 to 104 1/2. These facts in England have had not the slightest effect. The credit of this province has been maintained at the highest standard.

It was impossible to say exactly until a year after that the earnings of the T. & N. O. Railway were. The sum of \$550,000 represented approximately the amount obtained from the excess of receipts over operating expenses. It had to be borne in mind that, although the track had been laid up to the terminus, much had yet to be done, grading and ballasting in some cases as much as 12 feet, and new steel bridges had to be put in. Therefore it had been found necessary to advance some \$225,000 during the past year.

Of assistance to railways, \$4,000,000 was still owing, the whole of which would be paid in 1910 and the great bulk within 20 years. In connection with the hydro-electric loan, it must be borne in mind that the whole of the \$3,000,000 more, which the province had to pay, would be paid by the municipalities.

Meeting of the Trusts. "We are not manufacturing power. We are simply conveying the same. None but a government could interfere. This government has interfered and the result is that the people are getting a large amount of cheap power, which will be well worth the capital expenditure of \$1,000,000, and other places are in the same position. There will be no profits on watered stock."

hydro-electric, and the complaint that the people were not permitted access to the courts he said, "If my memory serves me, there was a case in excess of the court. It was decided in favor of the government."

He did not want to disparage the Northwest, but Ontario in 1909 had got more for her field crops than the Ontario fruit farmer had made \$10,000 profit of 26 acres. New Ontario was not only going ahead in mining, but farmers were getting the most out of their land.

Opposition Criticism. J. D. McNaught (East Toronto), who led off for the opposition, claimed that the prosperity of the country was due to the legacy of the late government. But why should the expenditure be increased in four or five years from \$5,267,000 to \$10,374,000? No credit was due the government for the increase in succession duties or the Dominion subsidy.

Good Feature of Popular Loan. The only good feature he had in the popular loan was that it had given small amounts of money to the people. He was encouraged to bring money into the country, and the people of the land should invest in something better than 4 per cent.

It is a good thing to give the people of the province cheap electricity, but when it comes to carrying it in a capable and statesmanlike manner.
