THE AUTO INDUSTRY.

The automobile factories in Detroit and elsewhere are said to be running day and night in the effort to keep up with the demand. It is estimated that 400,000 automobiles will be made this year in the United States. It is not easy to grasp the enormous significance of the figures without the use of special demonstrations.

Allowing 30 feet for each car the 400,000 would make a line 2,273 miles long. A \$1,000 a car a little more than 5 1/2 miles would represent an output of a million dollars. A large per centage of the cars made sell for much higher prices than \$1,000 each, and the average satisfactory price is perhaps not less than that sum.
