FERRY LAW.

At a Court of Common Council, holden at the City Hall of the City of Saint John, on Thursday the 23d day of November, A. D. 1848:

Read and enacted the following Law: A Law to regulate and establish the rates of FERRIAGE to be charged for Ferriage in the Steam Ferry Boats of this City...

BE it ordained by the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of Saint John, in Common Council convened, That the present Ferry over the Harbour of Saint John, from the Floats at present used on the East side of the harbour...

Table listing various items and their rates for ferriage, including Foot Passengers, Children, Ox Horse, Elephant or Camel, Single Wagon, Double Wagon, etc.

Carts, Sleds, Drays and Carriages same as Waggon; and all other things in proportion; and that it shall and may be lawful for the persons in charge of such Ferry to ask, demand and receive the amount of all Ferringes previous to leaving either of the Floats.

III. And be it ordained, That every person or persons riding, leading or driving any Horse, Mare or Gelding, shall, on coming to the Floats on either side of the said harbour...

IV. And be it ordained, That any person or persons carrying over any horned cattle in either of the said Ferry Boats, shall and they are required to procure sufficient fastenings to prevent the said Horned Cattle from injuring or interfering with Foot Passengers...
