SKATING.

South End Finals.
The final races of a series to determine the championship of the south end will be run off this evening. The events are the senior half mile and junior mile.

Lower World Mark.
At Saranac Lake yesterday Gladys Johnson of Toronto skated 220 yards in 23 1-5 seconds, three-fifths faster than world's record for women previously held by her. In the professional event, Margaret McGowan won the 440 and one mile and finished third in one—440 yards, 38 seconds; mile, 2 minutes and 48 1-5 seconds; three mile, minutes and 46 seconds. A half-mile amateurs was won by Leslie Body Lake Placid, time 1 minute and 33 seconds. The 440 yards for boys of six, won by Ollie Green of Saranac Lake, time 49 2-5 seconds. The 220 yards boys of fourteen, won by Earl Finch Lake Placid, time 22 1-5 seconds. The 100 yards for boys of twelve years, won Ned Mulford, time 24 seconds.

The New Aces.

The amateur skating crown for the present outdoor season fits well on William Steinmetz, Chicago speedster on the blades. For a time it appeared that technically might deprive Steinmetz the distinction, or at least provide a bet for the escape of premier honors. Judges who ruled against any re-acting acted wisely and there can be no doubt on the Chicagoan's record. Even admitting the possibility of a Jewtraw in the Diamond Trophy race at Lake Placid last week, as some Jewtraw's followers advocated, Steinmetz was entitled to his honors. He skated international championship at Placid, with a total of 100 points for Jewtraw, and this victory, plus what he did in the Diamond Trophy race, would be sufficient to determine the issue. Jewtraw's sportmanlike action in the favor of the Chicagoan won for the Placid skater many friends. The second honors unquestionably belong Jewtraw. The Lake Placid skater led to win first place in any of the important skating series of the season, but his work generally was more consistent than that of Joe Moore and Joe McWhirter, both of whom succeeded in gaining titles. Moore won the diamond honors in a tournament in which Steinmetz, Jewtraw, McWhirter, Moore, Hearn and other skaters took part. This was the first of the four diamond tournaments, and it caused a great deal of interest. Moore failed to finish the three leaders in either the international or the national championship, but got third place in the Diamond trophy competition. Jewtraw, finishing second in each of the four important tournaments, clearly earned the distinction of being the national champion. Third honors for the year go to Moore, despite McWhirter's national championship. The Chicagoan clashed with New Yorkers in all four tournaments. In three of them the Easterner outdist his rival. Each of the three dethroned skaters placed where the Diamond trophy figures place them.
