She has sternly set her face against those citizens or German agents who have sought to arrange shipments of supplies to Germany that a strict re-gard for neutrality might consider con-traband. She has not stretched the law to favor Germany; if there has been any stretching it has been in favor of the Allies. On the other hand, Sweden and Holland, either through fear of the Kaiser or in response to pressure of their own subjects who found the business very lucrative, have favored Germany in every interpretation of the word contra-band. It is difficult to believe that the people of Holland are pro-German with the red record of Belgium staring them in the face. That Sweden is pro-German is not denied, and in the view of Mr Cunlife Owen, Denmark, in spite of its royal ties with Britain and Russia, is also pro-German.



Norway Hates the Germans. In Norway it is the German language that one dare not use in public. So strong is the sentiment against Germany that last year the Norwegian govern-ment refused permission to a leading Berlin orchestra to give a series of con-certs at Christiania, on the ground that the appearance of a body of Germany, however musical and long-haired, would surely lead to trouble. It is generally supposed that the friendly attitude of Norway is due to the fact that the Queen is the sister of King George, and the King was the favorite son-in-law of the late King Edward. But Norway is much too democratic a country to adopt a course of action out of regard to the affiliations or wishes of its royal house, and she favors the cause of the allies
