"Tar Baby" Trims Jeannette.
Paris, Dec. 20.—Sam Langford, the negro heavyweight pugilist, was awarded the decision on points over Joe Jeannette, of Hoboken (N. J.), also a negro, at the end of the 20th round of a fast contest held tonight at Luna Park. The fight was considered in France to be for the heavyweight championship of the world.

Langford forced the fighting throughout the battle. Jeannette took count nine three times in the 18th round and at the end of the 20th was barely able to stand. In the twelve, fifteenth and nineteenth rounds Jeannette landed hard blows on his opponent, but they were ineffective. Jeannette's gameness frequently brought cheers from the crowd of spectators.

SECRET OF PIRATE'S GOLD.
"During the captivity of Napoleon on St. Helena the British government sent a company of soldiers from the Cape to occupy the island of Tristan d'Acunha. They were recalled before the death of the emperor, and all of them hailed with joy the end of their dismal exile, all with the exception of a certain Corporal Glass whose time had expired. He asked to stay. His example influenced another married soldier, and their two households proceeded to form a colony on this last outpost of civilization. In 1849 the Galates, with the Duke of Edinburgh on board, anchored off the island and was visited by the descendants of the soldiers, one of whom, a son of Glass, told the officers of the Galates a queer story.

"When the English detachment from the Cape reached the island they found a strange solitary being, a real Titan of Athens, who seemed much annoyed at having his solitude disturbed, and studiously hid himself," says the Paris Journal des Debats. "A watch was kept, and he was seen one night apparently carrying a heavy load. Two or three times afterward he was noticed at the same job, and he always disappeared when he felt that his movements were perceived.

"One soldier, who was cleverer than the others, discovered the cave in which he lived. It was furnished with the debris of a shipwreck. Among other things there was a pot full of Spanish doubloons. At first the occupant of the cave tried to escape, but gradually he was humored into sociability, and then declared himself to be Thomas Corri, an Italian, who was the only survivor of a shipwreck.

"Day by day more and more of his history came out, until the questioners got on the track of a battle between pirates, and the murder, by this man, of his surviving comrades in order to get sole possession of a hoard of treasure. This he began to hide when the Galates arrived. He was just about to reveal the hiding place when, truth proving once more stranger than fiction, he suddenly died, and with him died the secret of his hoard. Try as they might, and they had plenty of time, Corporal Glass and his friends could never penetrate the secret."
