of a general peace, the peoples of Germany and Austria-Hungary are being

Up to August, 1914, the total of those built had numbered 25; since hostilities began the two great works at Friedrich-shafen and Staaken have constructed between 75 and 80, probably near the lower than the higher figure. As the mean period for the building of a Zeppelin is known with certainty to be two months, there must always have been four new airships on the stocks at the same time.

Most of the Zeppelins launched into the air before the war came to grief, thus leaving in the service of the German army and navy a fleet of less than a dozen when fighting began.
