## CENTRAL POWERS ARE DECEIVING THEIR PEOPLE

Monstrous Object of Annexation, Says Bolshevik

WOULD SUFFOCATE RUSSIA

Programme and Platitudes do Not Agree—Forty Killed in Moscow Riots on Anniversary of Bloody Sunday

London, Jan. 23.—The Russian government, according to a wireless message, has issued two communications addressed "to all" the object of which is to intimate to the world that, by the declaration of the German foreign secretary, Dr. Von Kuhlmann, that the Central Powers cannot remove their armies from the occupied regions until the conclusion of a general peace, the peoples of Germany and Austria-Hungary are being deceived. One communication asserts that the

annexationists have been sufficiently powerful to impose their will upon the evasive diplomats of the Von Hertling-Von Kuhlmann school, but that the governments of the Central Powers do not dare divulge this to their own peoples, and continues: "Their object is monstrous, the annexation of Poland, Lithuania, Courland, Riga, parts of Latvia, Moon Sound and the islands, with the purpose of the complete economic and political suffocation of Russia, while the role of the Austrian representatives at Brest-Litovsk has been limited to humble approval."

"Austrian statesmen are appealing their restless workmen by affirming that the Central Powers are striving for a democratic peace, but to have such a programme and to talk at the same time of a democratic peace surpasses even the limits permitted to diplomacy."

BAPTIST CHURCH AT CHIPMAN BURNED.

In a disastrous blaze at Chipman, N. B., on Tuesday the Baptist church was burned to the ground. The origin of the fire is unknown and when the fire was first discovered it had taken too big a grip on the building to be put out and there was nothing to do but watch the edifice burn to the ground. The building is a modern one and although there is some insurance, the loss will be felt keenly by the congregation. The residence and outbuildings at Riverside occupied by John Danahy and owned by his mother-in-law, Mrs. Duffy, were burned to the ground on Tuesday morning. The contents of the lower part were saved by the efforts of the fire-fighters and other buildings in the vicinity which were in danger were saved.

## ZEPPELIN BOGEY THING OF PAST

Reported Existence of Armadas of Them Entirely Mythical—Only About 100 Built

French Front, Jan. 17.—The Zeppelin bogey has been laid or, at least, the major part of its terrors have vanished, since reliable information shows the reported existence in Germany of great armadas of these aerial dreadnoughts to have been absolutely mythical. Altogether only just over 100 of these dirigibles have been constructed since the late Count Zeppelin launched the first one over Lake Constance.

Up to August, 1914, the total of those built had numbered 25; since hostilities began the two great works at Friedrichshafen and Staaken have constructed between 75 and 80, probably near the lower limit of the higher figure. This means an average of two per month. As the mean period for the building of a Zeppelin is known with certainty to be two months, there must always have been four new airships on the stocks at the same time.

Most of the Zeppelins launched into the air before the war came to grief, thus leaving in the service of the German army and navy a fleet of less than a dozen when fighting began. Since then nearly all the dirigibles, old and new, have been handed over to the German navy, which has used them for many

kinds of work, such as bombarding expeditions, protection of mine-layers and small torpedo boats at sea, chasing submarines, searching for mine fields, and last and most important, reconnoitering for the high seas fleet.

The death of Robert F. McVey took place on Monday at the home of his nephew, John A. Doherty, Moncton. He was sixty-eight years of age and a former resident of Memramcook and Sydney. He is survived by two brothers, who live in the United States, and two sisters, in Moncton, Mrs. M. Powers and Miss F. McVey.
