THE CONSUMER'S NEED A Woodstock despatch says that dealers are offering 70 cents per barrel for potatoes, while at Houlton, Maine, the price is \$1.10.

Under the revised American tariff the farmers of New Brunswick will be able to get better prices for their potatoes, but not so good as if reciprocity had been adopted. There will still be a duty of ten per cent on potatoes from this province, because Canada imposes a duty on potatoes from the United States.

The utterly untruthful assertion is made by Tory newspapers that under the revised American tariff Canada will receive more benefit than under reciprocity. The duty on potatoes is one answer, in this year when this province will have a very large surplus of potatoes to export; but it is not merely the New Brunswick exporter who will fail to derive as much benefit from a lower American tariff as from reciprocity.

The Canadian consumer will not long be satisfied with a condition of affairs which helps one section of the community, but is a disadvantage rather than a benefit to all the rest. The mechanic in St. John will not relish higher prices for products which he must buy, without any opportunity, at any season of the year, to get a compensating reduction in some direction. It will not increase his earnings or lessen his household expenses to know that the protected interests are able to pay large dividends because of higher protection.

The insincerity of the Tories in the federal election campaign is now apparent. Then they asserted that reciprocity would divert Canada's trade to channels worth and south, and destroy her great railway systems. If they were sincere then, they should now be devising some scheme to prevent the export of Canadian produce to the United States. But they were not sincere. They merely sought to befool the Canadian people.

A STRONG MAN The sudden death of Mayor William J. Gaynor of New York will greatly complicate the situation in the coming municipal elections in that city. He had consented to run again for the mayoralty of Greater New York, but had broken with Tammany Hall and the Democratic machine, and would have run on an independent ticket supported by the Gaynor League, which was organized to conduct the campaign. Mr. Gaynor was elected on the Tammany ticket in 1909, but alienated the support of the gang politicians by carrying out reform measures.
