INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENTS.

The record of industrial accidents maintained in the department of labor in Ottawa, for August, showed that eighty-eight workmen were killed and 305 injured, compared with 108 fatal and 272 non-fatal accidents during July, or a decrease of twenty in the number of fatal accidents and an increase of thirty-three non-fatal accidents. The largest number of fatalities occurred in the building trades and in the steam railway service, there being eleven workmen killed in the former and twenty-five in the latter. In the metal trades and steam railway service, the largest number of non-fatal accidents occurred, the record being sixty-five in the former and fifty-three in the latter.

EASTERN COMPANY'S PLANS FOR YARMOUTH

In Yarmouth yesterday Calvin Austin, president of the Eastern S. S. Co., talked of plans of the company for increasing accommodations for tourists there and for the development of tourist travel. He said that the company intended to improve its shipping facilities, and also to provide more and larger steamers to care for the increasing summer travel. The present steamers, Prince Arthur and Prince George are to be enlarged, and will be replaced by more commodious ships as soon as the latter can be built. There is a probability that the channel at Yarmouth will have to be widened as the company purposes to place the steamer "Old Colony" on the run next summer. It is the intention also to secure permission from Ottawa to install cold storage equipment for the carriage of perishable goods.
