Mr. Lawson in his own report showed 30 new members had been added to the roll during the year and the total of active members was 148 and the clubhouse was becoming more and more of a real community centre. The sports committee report showed that during the previous year badminton had been inaugurated, a quilt bed provided and a volleyball court constructed. Tennis had been a big feature of the club program and there were many novelty dances besides the regular program of dances. The treasurer, H. C. Wilson, reported that the finances of the club were in excellent condition and had been very greatly strengthened in the last year.

ATHOLVILLE CHURCH DEDICATED SUNDAY

New Catholic Edifice to Seat 1,000 Opened With Impressive Ceremonies.

CAMPBELLTON, May 26.—A new Catholic church, "Our Lady of Lourdes," was dedicated by Bishop Ross, of Gaspe, Que., at Atholville, three miles from here, Sunday. About 1,200 people witnessed the impressive ceremony which was followed by a dinner in the Town Hall given by Rev. F. M. Lantaigne, parish priest, to those who took part in the ceremony and to the visitors.

The church, which is not yet completed, is a wooden building that will be encased with brick by July. It will seat 800 in the main auditorium and 200 in the gallery. The architect was R. A. Frechette and the style is Roman. It is 126 by 62 feet and has a vestry and winter chapel 80 by 40 feet.

De Lamotte, superior of the Sacred Heart College at Bathurst, was deacon for the pontifical high mass at the dedication services on Sunday, and Fr. Paul Levesque, parish priest of Val-des-Moutures. Rev. A. Boucher, of West Bathurst, was assistant priest. Rev. Fr. Forest, secretary to Bishop Ross, was master of ceremonies. Rev. Wilfred Lagace presided the sermon.

SPECIAL CHOIR.

A special choir was assembled. Seraphin Leger, M. L. A., was organist and David Champoux, Campbellton, was choir director. At the evening service Rev. Nazaire Savoye, Petit Rocher, preached in English. Solemn benediction was given by Rev. W. De Lamotte, assisted by Father Melanson and Rev. Father De Lagarde, Nash's Creek. Father Verret, of Campbellton, exposed the blessed sacrament.

Some Odd Figures Of English Marriages

LONDON, May 27.—Marriage is still prevalent in Great Britain despite divorce courts and sex novels and plays, and numbers among its victims people of from 15 to 99 years of age. Census figures show that there are 98 wives of 15 and two husbands of the same age. There are eight husbands of 99, and three wives of 97.

The oldest married couple totals 193 years—husband 98 and wife 95; the youngest totals 32 years—16 each for husband and wife. One woman of 90 has a husband of 20; one husband of 78 has a wife of 15.
