Circular on religi-
ous instruction—
Chief Supt. of

Received a Circular from Dr. Ryerson, Chief Superintendent of Schools for Upper Canada, in relation to religious instruction in the Public Common Schools, and requesting a deliverance of Synod on the subject. It was agreed to refer the circular to the Committee for the Distribution of Preachers, consisting of the Rev. Messrs. Ormiston and Dick, and the Rev. Dr. Jennings, who shall report their action in the matter, at next meeting of Synod.

Temperance, ro-
hibition.

There were presented to the Synod, several papers on the subject of Intemperance, and the enactment of a Prohibitory Liquor Law, namely:—a Memorial from the Grand Division Sons of Temperance:—a Memorial from the Grand Lodge of the Order of Good Templars:—a Memorial, accompanied with a list of Convictions before Justices of Peace, in the County of Perth, from John J. E. Linton, Esq., Clerk of the Peace for the said County:—all praying the Synod to adopt measures to abate the Intemperance prevailing throughout the country, and to obtain the enactment of a law prohibiting the traffic in intoxicating liquors.
