FIRST EDITION. THE DRY DOCK.

ENGINEER BOSWELL'S REPORT IN THE HANDS OF THE MAYOR.

What the Report Says in regard to Mr. Leary's Plans and Specifications for a Dry Dock and Harbor Improvement Scheme.

After referring in general terms to the plans and specifications upon which he was asked to deal, the engineer's report speaks of the most important considerations to be kept in view in building a dry dock or wet dock as being: "That the gate or caisson should be designed so as to be readily closed or opened, and so that it was in closed it would form a water tight joint."

As the vessel was being berthed alongside the pier every one in the thousands who were present, with night and main at the little party of men on the upper deck. "Where is Stanley?" was an exclamation heard on all sides.
