The losses in 1877 on account of the shrinkage of railroad securities amount to not less than one-sixth of the national debt of the United States, and involve about a sixth of the entire railroad investment of the country.

It appears from Messrs. Dun, Wymann & Co.'s statement of the business failures in 1877, that New Brunswick shows a greater proportion of failures to the number of traders than any of the other Provinces, though the average liability is smaller.

In 1876, New Brunswick occupied a better position in this respect than any of them, and the change noted must be attributed to the disastrous fire. The published statement is as follows:-
