Fredericton, N. B., November 18, 1932. — Statistics, issued today by the New Brunswick Governement Bureau of Information and Tourist Travel show a decrease of 10 percent. In the tourist trade in this province up to October 31st of this year as compared to the corresponding period in 1931. The trade this year, however, is practically equal to the tourist traffic in 1930, according to the figures supplied the New Brunswick mureau by the customs ports of entry along the international boundary.

These figures deal only with the tourists entering New Brunswick from the United States, but officials of the Bureau of Information and Tourist Travel declare the traffic from Quebec and Ontario this year to have been larger than at any other time. The decrease in tourist traffic from the United States into New Brunswick is the smallest reported by any of the three Maritime Provinces this year and is less than several other Canadian provinces.

The automobile tourist parties entering New Brunswick for stays of more than 24 hours and not more than 60 days up to October 31, 1932, total to 48,3444 against 544,633 in 1931, 6,707 of which entered at the Edmundston port, against 5,466, in 1931.

Among 26 ports of entry, Edmunds ton comes in third rank.
