PORTAGE VALE HAS ANNUAL CANDY PULL Gifford Bros Hold Function in which Young and Old Participate—Several Farms Taken Up.

Portage Vale, Kings Co., April 12.—Gifford Bros., and R. M. Gross, the station agent at Anagnos, gave an outdoor candy party yesterday. The party was held at "Maple Heights," where Gifford Bros. have given a like social event for the past number of years.

The afternoon was spent by all in a most desirable manner. The candy was given out by Gifford Bros. on their splendid entertainment. On their farm in Albert County, where they lived before coming to Portage Vale, they had many thousand maple trees and they carried on to a large extent maple sugar operations.

Charlottetown, April 14.—The body of Joseph Conway, laborer, aged 46, was found today near Pownal wharf. He was last seen alive on Thursday night, under the influence of liquor, lying on a back yard. He is supposed to have wandered down to the wharf and fallen overboard. An inquest will be held Wednesday.

Fort William, Ont., April 14.—The hot sun yesterday started the ice disintegration. The icebreaker "Whelan" has already made a path through the ice to both harbors, but there is still considerable apprehension about the state of things down around Whitefish Point, whence reports come that the weather is having apparently little effect on the icefield.

Fredericton, April 14.—Notice has been given that letters patent incorporating the Kingston Peninsula Telephone Co., Ltd., will be applied for. The object of the company is to establish and operate a farmers' telephone line in Kings County between the rivers St. John and Kennebecasis, and between Lands End and Kingston Creek. About fourteen miles of line will be constructed at the outset and the remainder will follow next year.

Leaders of the Kuomintang, the radical revolutionary party, assert they have proof that the recent murder of Sun Chiao-jen, at Shanghai, first declared to have been "by mistake," was inspired by persons very close to President Yuan Shih-kai and that, instead of being a case of mistaken identity, it was part of a plot to murder eight of the Kuomintang leaders.

25% MARKET PRICE OF A WOMAN IN MONTREAL. Sensational Fact Brought Out, Yesterday, in Hearing of Case Against Two Alleged "White Slavers".

Montreal, April 14.—That a woman can be bought in Montreal for twenty-five dollars was one of the sensational facts brought to light during the preliminary investigation opened before Judge Lanctot today in the case of Alexander Corony and "Mike" Martin, two alleged "white slavers" who were arrested by Inspector O'Keefe of the morality squad last week.

COL. SAM HUGHES PLEADS PRIVILEGE. Montreal, April 14.—In the libel case of R. A. MacNab against Hon. Sam Hughes, minister of militia, the latter's lawyer, Eugene Lafleur, K. C., has notified Chas. Gaudet, attorney for Mr. MacNab, that Col. Hughes is entitled to plead privilege in the case, so it was announced today.

ALBERT NEWS. Albert, April 14.—The recently appointed road commissioner under the new road law, Job Stiles, gives promise of being a very efficient officer, judging from the work already accomplished in repairing the damage caused by the late rains.

FIRE IN STEAMER IN BOSTON. Boston, Mass., April 14.—Fire in hold 2 of the British steamer Karama threatened heavy damage today. The vessel arrived Saturday from Calcutta and Colombo with a cargo of burmah, jute and other goods valued at \$1,000,000. The blaze was discovered Friday 300 miles out, but was not known to the harbor authorities until today.

It is not likely that General Li Yuan-hung, provisional Vice President of China, and commandant at Wuchang, will lend himself to any plot to overthrow President Yuan, though his name is mentioned as a possible Kuomintang candidate for the Presidency. He is not a member of that party. It has been but a few months since General Li was charged by Kuomintang leaders with responsibility for the summary shooting of three military officers sent from Wuchang to Peking, and in consequence it has been the purpose of the Kuomintang politicians to drive him from the Vice Presidency. President Yuan has had the cordial support of the Vice President since the formation of the provisional government.

WESTERN NEWSPAPERS HAD LIVELY TROUBLES. Interesting Mixture of Politics and Financial Difficulties for Rival Papers in McLeod, Alberta. McLeod, Alb., April 14.—Financial difficulties not unmix with politics just now in the West. J. T. McDonald, a leading Liberal acting for the Toronto Type Foundry, instituted a seizure by the sheriff of the plant of the Spectator (Conservative) for an indebtedness of \$1,200. Dal Grier, a prominent Conservative, advanced the cash, and released the plant, and in turn, sent the sheriff to the publisher of that paper.
