The Norwegian steamship Wagama, Capt. J. A. Otervoid, reached Boston Tuesday from Louisburg. The captain declared that navigation on the Nova Scotia coast is rendered hazardous because of the fact that most of the steamships and schooners are running without lights on account of the war, and reported that his vessel narrowity escaped collision with a fishing schooner off Sable Island. The fishing schooner was sighted just in time to change the steamship's course, and she brushed by the fisherman with only a few inches of clear water between them. Capt. Otervoid stated that at 4 p. m. Monday, when about 60 miles east of Highland Light, he sighted a white painted man of-war. The British made no signals and paid no attention to the Wagama, and she continued on her way without interruption.
