NAVIGATION HAZARDOUS

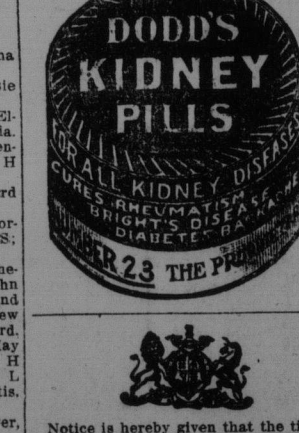
The Norwegian steamship Wagona, Capt. J. A. Ottervoll, reached Boston Tuesday from Louisburg. The captain declared that navigation on the Nova Scotia coast is rendered hazardous because of the fact that most of the steamships and schooners are running without lights on account of the war, and reported that his vessel narrowly escaped collision with a fishing schooner off Sable Island. The fishing schooner was sighted just in time to change the steamship's course, and she brushed by the fisherman with only a few inches of clear water between them. Capt. Ottervoll stated that at 4 p. m. Monday, when about 60 miles east of Highland Light, he sighted a white painted man-of-war. The British made no signals and paid no attention to the Wagona, and she continued on her way without interruption.

SCHOONER LEAKING

Half filled with water and flying a signal of distress, the three-masted schooner Clifford I. White, bound from Machias to New York, laden with lumber, was sighted three miles west of Handkerchief Lightship by Capt. Crowell of the steamer Herman Winter, which reached Boston Tuesday. The schooner, when sighted, was leaking badly, and although her pumps were going constantly the water had rained in the hold and she was half full. Capt. Crowell brought the schooner close to the side of the schooner and the captain of the ill-fated vessel requested that a revenue cutter be dispatched to assist him. Capt. Crowell upon reaching port notified the marine department of the Boston Chamber of Commerce and the revenue cutter Acadanet, at Woods Hole, was sent to aid the distressed vessel.

THE DIFFERENT CROPS IN NEW BRUNSWICK

Report submitted to the local Board of Trade shows increase in all but hay and grain.

The Board of Trade has received a very satisfactory report on the agricultural outlook of the province from F. del. Clements, chairman of the trade and commerce committee of the board. He covered in his inspection almost the entire province as far as St. Hilare, or the Quebec boundary. He says that the acreage in potatoes this year will be at least one-quarter more than ever before in the history of the province. He estimates the year's potato crop at 1,500,000 barrels. The acreage of hay and grain is slightly less than last year. Mr. Clements says he found every indication of splendid crops in all lines of agriculture. He was particularly impressed with the clean culture of the hoe crops. Especially was this apparent between Woodstock and Edmundston. With respect to orchard conditions on the St. John river, he states that the section from Woodstock to St. John, particularly between Fredericton and Woodstock, is preparing a surprise for the province by its acreage of very choice export fruit. One farm at Springhill, five miles above Fredericton, has eighty-three acres in apple trees. The trees are making a rapid growth. Mr. Clements suggests that crop statistics should be prepared annually, so that information could be obtained on which to base estimates.

COMMITTED FOR TRIAL ON BRITISH CHARGE

Bail was refused, but application will be made to Supreme Court Judge.

Percy Warren and Bedford Hinds charged with rioting on the night of July 23, were committed for trial by Magistrate Ritchie yesterday morning. S. B. Bustin applied for bail for Warren but the magistrate said he could not grant it, and application will be made to a supreme court judge. Mr. Bustin called Mr. Warren who said her husband's name was Warren and not Warn. Mr. Bustin then asked for a dismissal on the ground that the prisoner had not been named or otherwise described in the warrant as required by the criminal code. The magistrate held that the point was too technical on which to grant dismissal. He spoke very strongly on the seriousness of a riot and said that in such a case the order of the king should be obeyed just as it should be now when we are in a state of war, no matter how severe the order may seem. He said that although the only evidence against the prisoner was that he had said all the while in town should be obeyed, still he was in the crowd and was liable. In the case of the deaf mute, while he did not think he knew the riot act was read, still the evidence showed that he had been trying to overturn one of the cars.

SERIOUS FIRE IN SYDNEY ST. Damage amounting about \$1000 - Firemen did good work. Fire damaged to the extent of one thousand dollars the premises 58 Sydney Street shortly before midnight. An alarm from box 2 called the fire department to the scene and took them about an hour to douse the flames. The damaged building was close to the Imperial Theatre for a time there was fear that this structure would be damaged, but firemen worked hard and confined the fire to the one building. The fire was in the premises owned by Fred W. Edleston, partner in R. Beys, wheelwright; a H. Baker, Howe and Emery, cabinet makers, and H. McGrattan and Son, monument builders. The fire quite a start and was only discovered when dense clouds of smoke were in the air by persons passing the street. When the firemen arrived on the scene the upper portion of the building, which is occupied by Edleston, was a mass of flames and secured through the windows. A rear of the building is the W. Beys, while the ground floor has Baker. The fire appeared to be in the upper floor and for a time of fire. Being close to the run in the alley of Sydney and cess streets and after a fight of half an hour the firemen had the short time, but with good street water the fire was confined to Edleston apartment and the damage to the floor occupied by Mr. J. and the bakery was mostly done water. Mr. Edleston is the heaviest and makes an estimate of about hundred dollars without insurance. The bakery is also said to be insured, while Mr. Beys has \$2000 on his stock and tools. From section of the building M. Howe and Emery, cabinet maker, H. McGrattan and Son, monument builders, are the tenants and escaped damage other than smoke.
