

COAL SHORTAGE IS GIVING GOVERNMENT GREAT CONCERN

Cabinet willing to guarantee payment of orders placed in United States.

Madrid, May 14.—The Spanish government is so much concerned over the scarcity of coal that the cabinet is willing to guarantee the payment of orders placed in the United States by opening a credit in New York to the amount of at least \$200,000.

The object of the government is specially to enable smaller concerns, those lesser known in the financial world, to have their American orders filled promptly. Great Britain has prohibited the export of coal or coke. Something like a coal famine exists throughout Spain, and large orders are being placed in the United States by Spanish companies.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years, renewable at an annual rental of \$1 an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton, in unmined territory the tract must be staked out by the applicant in person, and the application year or paid to the Agent of Dominion Lands for the district, in all cases be made, and the rental for the first year must be paid to the agent within thirty days after filing application.

QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over, having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,000 feet by 1,000 feet. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$500.00 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with, the claim may be purchased at \$1 an acre.

PLACING MINING CLAIMS are 100 feet long and from 1,000 to 2,000 feet wide. Entry fee, \$5. Not less than \$100 must be expended in development work each year.

DREDGING.—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$10 a mile per annum. Royalty, 25 per cent after the output exceeds 500,000.
