Will Sail Today.
Delayed last night by the fog, the
S.S. War Torment, laden with deals,
is expected to sail this morning, if
clear, for Brownhead, England.
Replaces the Granville.
The schooner Swan will replace the
coastal steamer Granville on the run
between St. John, Antigonish and In-
verness, Nova Scotia. The Granville was
purchased and taken over by the
Scientific Labrador Expedition, which
is in command of Lieut. Owens, R. A.
F., one of Eastern Canada's war
heroes.

Resuming Her Route.
The Eastern Steamship liner S.S.
Governor Dingley, arrived in port yes-
terday with over 350 passengers from
Boston and Maine ports. This is her
first trip since coming off the books
where she was undergoing repairs.

Putting Down New Light.
Before coming to this port, the D.
G. S. Aboulen, now in the St. John
district marine and fisheries service,
will put down a new light and bell
buoy marking the "Hen and Chick-
en" in Yarmouth Sound, which will
also place a substitute for the Larcher
Lightship which is due for an annual
overhauling.

Sails From France for Cargo.
The S.S. Morie C., launched yes-
terday at the Coalbrook yard, Port Gre-
ville, has been chartered by Nalgie &
Wignmore for ten trips in the pulp
trade between Yarmouth and New
York.

Discharging Cargo.
The R. M. S. P. Chignecto, which
arrived yesterday morning is discharg-
ing her cargo of 1,500 tons of sugar
at the refinery plant. She also carries
1,200 bunches of molasses and con-
siderable tropical produce. In addi-
tion to molasses, she carried 165 passen-
gers.

**OCEAN LINERS HELD
UP BY STRIKE
AT LIVERPOOL**
All Liners Due to Sail from
There Yesterday Were Un-
able to Get Away.

Liverpool, July 22.—Virtually all the
liners due to sail from Liverpool to-
day were unable to leave their docks
because of a strike of dock gate-men
in sympathy with the men engaged
on the dredges who are out. By the
end of the week it is feared that the
30,000 dredgers in Liverpool will join
the strikers.

**NORTHUMBERLAND
LIBERALS ARE NOT
VERY ENTHUSIASTIC**
Very Few Out for Conven-
tion — Resolutions Ignore
Local Government — The
Hon. Peter failed to Honor
Convention With His Pre-
sence.

Newcastle, July 22.—The Liberal
convention here this afternoon could
not be called a grand success. There
were about fifty party units up large-
ly of the followers of John Morley.
Old-time Liberals like John J. P.
Burrell, P. M. Twiss, George Hales,
Thomas Parker and others were
conspicuous by their absence, while
Dr. McGrath, M. L. A., was not in evi-
dence.

D. J. Buckley presided with An-
thony Adams of Chatham as master
of ceremonies. Resolutions regretting
the death of the late Sir Wilfrid Laur-
ier, and in appreciation of the work
of our soldiers overseas were passed,
but the local government, evidently,
is not viewed with favor as they were
not in the convention. The
president said the meeting had been
called at the request of Mr. Morley,
and announced that all Liberal Union-
ists were welcome to the fold.
Speeches were delivered by Hon. Robert
Murray, Dr. Moore, John Morley and
Andrew Arnscliff.

The delegates selected for Ottawa
were D. V. Allan, D. P. Sullivan and
James Robinson, the latter being ap-
pointed in his absence. Alternates,
W. B. Sturwell, Andre Arnscliff, Dr.
W. T. Ryan.
The president expressed regret that
no Liberal Unionist could be found to
go to Ottawa.

The resignation of the president and
secretary were then accepted and John
Vanderbeck and A. B. Skid were
elected in their stead.
Hon. Peter Veniot although in town
did not attend.

**PROPOSED STRIKE
FOR ITALY MONDAY
PROVED A FIASCO**
People of Rome Rejoice in
Having Proven the Useless-
ness of Attempts to Throw
Italy in Chaos.

Rome, July 21.—(By the Associated
Press.) Official reports received from
all parts of Italy show that the pro-
posed general strike, called for today,
was a complete failure. Calm pre-
vailed everywhere, and everywhere the
public services were all in normal
operation.
"The fiasco could not have been
more complete," says the Popolo, of
Rome. "The unrevolutionary attitude
of the country could not have been
more determined. We must rejoice in
having thus proven the uselessness of
attempts to throw Italy into chaos,
ruin and starvation."
