

IN PROTEST **FIRM STAND** Dublin, June 15—The removal of personal arms from the officers of an American ship which arrived at Dub-lin became the subject of fuquiry by the American Consular officials today. When the freighter Milwankee Bridge arrived at Dublin recently the police took pistols from the captain and three other officers under pretext that a raid for arms by Sinn Feiners was feared. It is pointed out that a ship, while in port, is amenable to local law but the American officials want as-surance that there is an apparent ne-cessity for the seisure of arms in Irish ports.

The tax of ten per cent, now applies on men's hats over \$7 each. Formerly hats were taxed over \$6: Underwear (except silk is now tax-able over \$4 per garment, or \$8 for union suits. Formerly these figures were \$2 and \$6 respectively. Velvet, velveteens, plush and silk goods are now taxable at prices over \$2 per yard (ten per cent). This tax former-ily applied to such articles at any price. Ribbons, lace and braid, for-merly taxable at any price, is now assessed on prices lighter than 50 cents per yard for general goods and collarctics at \$2. Tax on carpets and rugs is now confined to those costing more than \$6 per lineal yard of 21 inches wide. The word "cushions" was removed from the ligt of taxable articles. Snowshoes were removed from the list of taxable articles.
