

at a meeting of the Indians of his tribe, while they consented to send their children to school and to everything else the Agent proposed, they declined to give up the Potlack, saying that they were advised by Capt Fitzstubb's Constable that the law had no power to punish it as an offence, and that they could go on as they had been doing. The Agent adds that this Constable is kept on under pay even after Capt Fitzstubb's departure for the coast.

The undersigned considers that this is a very serious matter, and that it would be advisable to bring it formally to the notice of the Provincial Government through the proper channel, with a
