LA PLATA'S **NEW PLANT**

Giving Most Satisfactory Results and Running Splendidly

Saving Effected is Far Greater Than Was Antic pated-. The Mine Was Never in Better Shape for Production

The mill and concentrator at the La Plata Mines, near Kokanee creek, better known to the public as the Molly Gibson, which started up for the first time at 3 o'clock on the afternoon of May 23, are having a most, successful run, the ma-chinery working smoothly and satisfactorily, and without the slightest hitch of any kind, and the results from a mining standpoint exceeding markedly the expec-

tations of the management. Captain T. H. Trethewey, superintendent of the property was at the Strathcona last evening, coming to the city for the first time since the new plant was started on May 23. To a representative of The Daily News captain Trethewey expressed his unbounded gratification at the working of the new plant and of the excellent sav-ing effected at the mill. "We have done much, better than I anticipated with such refractory ore to deal with as we have in the La Plata mine," said the superinten-dent. "Last Saturday and Sunday for instance the heads went 14 and 14 1-2 ozs. of silver to the ton, respectively, and the tailings were 2 1-2 one day and 2 the other. The lowest lead concentrates gave 112 028. silver per ton and the highest 156 028. The highest feed has yielded 23 1-2 028. of silver and the biggest loss in the tailing so far has been 7 2-10, to be exact.

"We have succeeded in assembling and starting the plant considerably ahead of my expectations for our directors hardly expected a start would be made before Supported a start would be integrated before yelly. Considering the very refractory ore we have to deal with I am very agreeably surprised at the results we have obtained, here again my expectations, as reported to the directors, have been greatly im-proved upon. The saving is really remark-ble under the conditions able under the conditions. "The plant has a guaranteed capacity of

"The plant has a guaranteed capacity of 75 tons per day, but its real capacity is be-tween 80 and 80 tons a day of 24 hours, per-haps I had better be conservative and say 80 tons at least. Just at the start we are running one shift of 12 hours a day, but as soon as I can get more men we will start running a double shift. The plant now running so satisfactorily con-sists of Jiggs of from two to five com-partments; Overstrom tables, and six flue vanners. The crushing plant consists of a Blake crusher, two setts of 36x14 inch rolls, and a five stamp battery for fine crushing. We have ordered and will shortly install a compressor and electric shortly install a compressor and electric light plant. light plant. "What is the cituation at the mine? It never was better. I am very pleased with conditions as I know them today. We are

conditions as 1 know them today. We are driving five levels and there is pay ore in each one of them. We are also making two raises and there is pay ore in each of them. The development work is away ahead of the mill requirements. We have been and will continue to rush develop-ment work. All told just now we are working 56 men, but we want more as outlekly as we can set sood men working to men, but we want more as quickly as we can get good men. . "Just now we are making two products--zinc and lead concentrates. What we will do in the future depends largely upon the rates offered. We may decide on making lead concentrates only. "Until we get the plant thoroughly ad-justed we shall only treat low grade ore, that is the ore carrying the lesser values.

Peasant Group in Lower House Put

Forward Advanced Program. St. Petersburg, June 5 .- The extent to

which socialistic theories have taken possession of the proletariat is evidenced by the agrarian program adopted by the radical peasant group in the lower house, which aims ultimately not only at the complete nationalization of land, with its attendant total abolition of private property, but the socialization of industry

The program provides for the creation of a national land fund from the crown, the church and private property ex-ceeding a certain amount in value, the state to pay for expropriated property, and in the cities the factories and mills o be gradually transferred to the state for the benefit of the workmen. After taking such land as is needed for state public needs, the remainder would be distributable to anybody desiring to till preference being shown to the local agriculturists. The workers of the sol would pay an occupation tax, varying in accordance with the character and amount of ground taken. Persons without means to purchase agricultural im-plements should be entitled to receive credit, from the land fund.
