A lineal descendant of the family of "The O'Donaghues of the Glen." Eld. s. of John O'Donaghue and Catherine Flynor, of the Co. Kerry, Irel. B. in the parish of Listry, in that county, Augt., 1844. Ed. there. Came to Can., 1852. M., 1870, Marie, only dau. of M. George Clontier, of Ottawa. Is Presdt. of the Ottawa Typographical Union, and 1st Vice-Presdt. of the Canada Labour League. First returned to Parl. for present seat, Jan., 1874, on the resignation of sitting mem. Ran as the "Workingman's Candidate," and is Independent in politics.—*O'tawa.*
