must personally enter into a Recognizance of Ten Pounds before the Clerk of the Peace of the District, together with two Sureties in Five Pounds each, that they will not use or suffer any unlawful games, and that they will keep good order and rule within their respective Houses; and if he, she or they shall be hindered by sickness or other reasonable cause to be allowed by the said Justices, that he, she or they must procure two Sureties to be then and there bound in the like manner in Ten Pounds each. And unto such persons as have not been Licenced for the year preceding; you are further to give notice, that no Licence will be granted to any of them unless every such person shall also at the same time and place, produce a Testimonial, should the same be required by the Justices, under the hands of the Minister and Church or Town Wardens, or otherwise of four reputable and substantial Householders of the Division; setting forth, that he is of good fame, and sober life and conversation, and as they believe, a good Subject of our Lord the King, having taken the Oath of Allegiance—Hereof fail not.
