

advantages with respect to collocation and payment out of the moneys paid in or levied, as they would have, if the marriage contracts of such married women and the *Acte* of tutorship of such tutors had been severally enregistered in the proper Registry offices on the day on which they were respectively entered into and granted, without prejudice to any recourse or to any actions which might be brought against such husbands or tutors for such rights and hypothecs, as by law provided. 5

IV. That with a view to giving greater publicity to judicial sales, and applications for confirmation and ratification of titles, the notices and publications now required by law, shall be given and inserted twice during the four months required, in the official gazette (Canada Gazette) and twice during the said four months, in such two public newspapers published in the District, as the Plaintiff shall determine. 10
