nesday on whether or not student Outgoing student union comptroller Peter Davidson said the -increase was necessary if students

expected "the amount of spending we've had in past years." At the end of August the student fi union will owe approximately \$15,000, largely as a result of debts accrued by Campus Services al Limited. If Atlantic Federation of Students fees go up to \$1.00 per student then another \$5-\$6,000 as will be gone. There will be around cl five new organizations on campus next year looking for money, said th

in the order of 10 per cent. Davidson said the increase m should be apportioned over three years to keep the level of real spending constant, so that eight sa dollars would be spent next year, ou nine the year after -- that, and 10 Sn dollars the third year. This way he du said, organizations would not hu expect large budget increases as was the case this year.
