Camp Borden	27-6-44		<p>Harvard 11 3268 groundlooped on the Main Aerodrome today at 1005 hours, causing a D category crash. The pilot, LAC Keeble, W.G. R224940 was uninjured.</p>	
	28-6-44		<p>0145 hours night flying washed in. Night flying time 44:15 hours. No flying the remainder of today.</p> <p>At 1000 hours today a District Court-Martial was held to try R.192916 AC2 Gordon Albert Rogers of this unit for desertion. The President was S/L A.E. Mix (C2432) from No. 1 Training Command; members were F/L W.J. Gladish (C4434) of No. 1 A.O.S., Malton and F/L A.A. Foster (C4254) of No. 1 I.T.S. The waiting member was F/L Alton (C7151) of this unit and the prosecutor F/L E.L. Claridge (C6563) of No. 1 I.T.S. F/O H.O. Bristow, (C13523) of No. 1 Training Command was the defending officer.</p> <p>Edenvale: Flying washed out. All personnel with exception of skeleton staff proceeded to Camp Borden for Sports Day.</p> <p>Today was the Camp Borden Sports Day for No. 1 S.F.T.S. At 0900 hours personnel paraded to the Sports Field and broke off to enter the various competitions. They made a very colourful parade as they marched led by the Station band, with everyone in sports clothes. It was exceptionally hot, although this did not in any way detract from the enthusiasm of our personnel. By the end of the day everyone was sun-tanned or subburned, depending on the individual.
