After reading it he said his judgment was that it was unnecessary to read the evidence, as no argument could get anywhere as Foster had been discredited by his own leader who would have been sympathetic to him and if he felt it necessary to take such action he did not think there was much to be said. He felt it would be a mistake to take any action such as expressing your feeling in the matter which Mr. Stewart thinks is one to be settled by the constituency. He also felt Foster's candidature would hurt the party in other constituencies.
