of a firm and lasting peace. From the farms and fisheries of Canada have gone great quantities of food to help prevent privation and starvation in many countries. From our mines and forests and factories have gone primary materials and manufactured products to help in the re-establishment of industry. We have tried to make the products of Canada available as widely as possible for the relief of human need.

Mowever, great as is the material need of the world today, even greater perhaps is a spiritual need the need for tolerance and co-operation. It will take time for the evil effects of hatred and of reliance upon force to be eliminated from the minds of men. It will take time to develop friendly sittitudes between peoples of erstwhile hostile and warring nations. We know, however, that conflict can be evoided where the minds of men are set against it. We believe that only by extending throughout the world ideals of mutual tolerance, of social co-operation, and of human brotherhood can peace be served. If there is to be enduring peace, wationality must be the Servant, not the Master, in world affairs. "Over all Nations is Humanity".
