

But let me go a step further.

Looking at what I said in the House of Commons on September 8, 1939, I find these words: "Hitler has said: 'Whoever lights the torch of war in Europe can wish for nothing but chaos.' 'Nothing but chaos' - that is what the leader of the Nazi party in Germany is seeking to bring upon the world today. And it is to prevent chaos becoming the fate of this and other lands that it becomes our duty, as citizens of Canada, to stand to a man in the defence of our country and at the side of Great Britain in the defence of freedom" We know, today, how near to chaos this world would be had Hitler and his Nazi hordes not been completely crushed and had the evil forces they loosed upon the world not been subdued, as we now also know, at the cost of years of unparalleled suffering and of millions of human lives.

Was I right or was I wrong when I told the House of Commons that the ambition of this dictator was not Poland, and after asking where he was creeping to, answered my own question as follows: "Into those communities of the north, some of which today say they are going to remain neutral, I tell them if they remain neutral in this struggle, and Britain and France go down, there is not one of them that will bear for long the name that is theirs at the present time.
