

- Q. How are they fastened to the cell block?
A. They aren't fastened to the cell block. It just sits on the top and is fastened by suspension wires to the ground.
- Q. At the top of these four uprights what sort of a building is it?
A. Just a little hut with a cat walk around the outside.
- Q. Did I understand you to say there is a railing around the cat walk?
A. Yes.
- Q. Just a single run?
A. I believe it is two, Sir, about 2½ feet high.
- Q. After this SUS who you believe was the accused was first seen on the top of the cell block and another SUS who you think was Gravel, what happened after that?
A. Inflammable material was passed up by other SUS and placed in the legs of the tower on the top of the cell block.
- Q. Is there a cement roof?
A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Will you tell the Court that there were no other SUS on the cell block other than these two chaps.
A. Yes.
- Q. Were there any of your staff standing near you?
A. I couldn't say.
- Q. You didn't discuss with other staff beside you at the time and speculate as to who it was on the roof?
A. No, Sir, I haven't talked to anyone else about it except for comparing notes about the cases as they pass.
- Q. Have you spoken to other staff about the fire?
A. Yes, I wanted to find out what happened to the tower but I haven't been able to find out.
- Q. Why?
A. I was just interested.
- Q. I thought you were there?
A. The tower was still standing then.
- Q. Did you discuss with other members of the staff the personnel of the SUS?
A. No, just the tower, not about the SUS.
- Q. Do you mean to say you haven't discussed this question of the fire in the tower with any of the staff since it happened?
A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Isn't that unusual?
A. No, Sir, we were warned.
- Q. I mean before the courts-martial were convened? You mean to say that you haven't discussed this?

JUDGE ADVOCATE

Hasn't he said that he has discussed it but not the accused.

DEFENCE

He hasn't said anything about discussing the case before the courts-martial.
