Gun cotton, on which lyddite and other high explosives are based, comes directly below the Japanese compound, while the cost of manufacture is onewhile the cost of manufacture is one-half that of gun cotton. Unlike ordi-nary explosives, which explode after they have pierced an iron plate, with shimose powder the piercing and the detonation are practically simultaneous. Thousands of fragments are scat-tered in all directions, which means the most fearful carnage when the explosion occurs on a ship's deck.

A TIP-LESS STATE.

Wisconsin Will Do Away With Petty Graft by Legislation-Hits the Waiters.

the Waiters.

Wisconsin is a tipless State, or will be when Governor La Follette signs the Stout bill against graft, which has been passed by the Legislature.

Senator Stout had no intention of warring on the tip system when he introduced his bill. His intention was to wipe out the petty grafting which has grown up through small commissions paid to buying agents and employes of corporation in making their purchases. It was with such a view that the bill was passed by both Houses.

It was not until the final vote was being taken in the Assembly that members discovered that if the bill passed it would wipe out the custom of giving tips or place the giver and receiver in danger of fine or imprisonment.

An attempt was made to have the bil laid over for a week for amendment, but the Assembly, by a large majority, refused to do this, taking the ground that doing away with tips would be a benefit rather than otherwise. The bill, which is very drastic, is as follows:

Whoever corruptly gives, offers or promises to an agent, employe or servant any gift or gratuity whatever, with intent to influence his action in relation to his principal's, employer's or master's business, or an agent, employe or servant who corruptly requests or accent a gift or gratuity and accent a gift or gratuity and accent a gift or gratuity and g ploye or servant who corruptly requests or accept a gift or gratuity or a promise to make a gift or to do an act beneficial to himself, under an agreement or with an understanding that he shall act in any particular manner in relation to his principal's, employer's or master's business, or an agent, employe or servant who, being authorized to procure materials, supplies or other articles either by purchase or contract for his principals, employer or master, or to employe service or labor for his principal, employer or master, receives directly or indirectly, for himself or for another, a commission, discount or bonus from the person who makes such sale or contract of furnishes such materials, supplies or other articles, or from a person who other articles, or from a person whe other articles, or from a person who renders such service or labors and any person who gives or offers such an agent, employe or servant such commission, discount or bonus, shall be punished by a fine of not less than than \$10 nor more than \$500, or by such fine and by imprisonment for not more than one year.

The Most Costly Perfume.

Of all floral essences the most fam-ous is the attar of roses, most of which comes from the Province of Kezanlik, in eastern Roumella, where the rose gardens, which lie along the sweet valgardens, which lie along the sweet valley of Maritza, extend for upwards of forty miles. Here nearly 6,000 pounds of the attar is produced every year, to make which 8,000 tons of roses is used, for it takes about 200 pounds of rose leaves to make a single ounce of the attar. The price of the Turkish attar, which is produced by distillation, is from £15 to £20 per pound, but that which comes from the south of France, where only a small quantity is produced, and that accidentally in carrying out another process; is much more costly, ewing to its particularly fine quality. The price of this is as much as £40 to £50 per pound.

Apart from roses, the south of France is the most famous flower-growing district in the world. Around the old-fashioned town of Grasse, which has

fashioned town of Grasse, which has been the centre of the perfume indusbeen the centre of the perfume industry for 200 years and more, there are acres on acres of sky-blue Parma violets, white jasmine, tube-rose, orange blossoms, and red roses. Nearly 4,500,000 pounds of orange blossoms, 4,000,000 pounds of rose leaves, 880,000 pounds, of jasmine and 650,000 pounds of violets are gathered every year at Grasse. At the time of the flower harvest the air is loaded with fragrance. From June to August the fields are full of busy flower pickers.

Knives in Cuba.

A party writing to The Post this morning mentions the knife-carrying habit so much in vogue in Cuba, and asks that we continue our campaign against it. We will continue the campaign against this vice until the proper notice has been taken of it, thought this be years from now. All of the lower classes, with hardly an exception, carry murderous knives. If they cannot afford to buy a knife from a store they find a piece of steel and sharpen it into a deadly weapon and carry it wrapped in a piece of paper about their clothes, ready to use on the slightest occasion. The result of this is many murders, which would not occur under other circumstances. If the police were instructed to keep on the watch for knife-carriers it would be but a very short time until the habit would become unpopular.
