REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manisoba or the Morth-West Turritorics, excepting 8 and 29, which has not been home-sizeded, or reserved the privide wood lots for entitient, or for other perposes, may be homewanded spon by any person who is the wole head of a family, or any mail over 18 years of ags, to the extent of one quarter section, of 160 acres, more or lean.

ENTRY.

Butry must be made personally at the local land office for the dis-trict in which the land is situate.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A sottler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act cod the amendments resto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of a following plans:-

(1) At least six months' randence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of the home-eader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be estimated by such person re-ding with the father or mother. the re

(3) If a settler was entitied to and has obtained entry for a second omestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain-ity patient may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if he second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

acres substantially fenced. The privilegs of a second entry is restricted by law to those settiors only who completed the dudges upon their first homesteads to entitle them to particle on or before the 2nd June, 1899. Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homestead is wise lable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again threw open for entry. APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Impector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.
