

# THE QUEBEC TRANSCRIPT.

Mr. Wm. Kennedy, who came out to this country with Lord Durham, and was associate commissioner on the Municipal Bill with Mr. Adam Thom, has arrived at Houston in Texas, and is described in the Houston Telegraph as the first Englishman of any celebrity that had been there, from whose reports of the country many advantages may be expected.

A block house of oak or pine timber is to be erected immediately on Fighting Island, near Sandwich, U. C., so as to render it capable of maintaining the significant name it bears. They had not previously lived comfortably together; and his wife left him to go to a gentleman's house where she was then acting as house-keeper; he went to see her, and after expostulating with her, on the propriety of her returning home with him, which, it is stated, she refused, he immediately plunged a knife or some such sharp instrument into her breast, a second into her side, and a third blow, it has been proved, entered the lungs, and in about twenty minutes the unfortunate woman breathed her last. He was arrested, and committed to Hamilton jail.—*Montreal Transcript.*

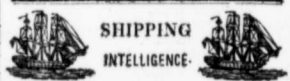

**REVIEW OF THE MONTREAL MARKETS FOR THE WEEK ENDING**  
 Friday evening, 12th July 1839.  
**Wheat**—Owing to a diminished demand have shown a tendency to decline, and the sales have been but limited. The nominal rate for white is 25s. 6d. @ 26s. and for Pearls 30s. 6d. @ 31s. per cwt. showing a reduction of 6d. per qt.  
**Flour**—Has been in considerable demand ever our last, and sales to the extent of about 100 bbls. of fine have been made principally 33s. @ 35s. 6d. per bbl. in the early part of the week; but since that time 33s. 9d. per bbl. has been refused, and 35s. is now generally asked; the advance on fine has had a tendency to check the demand. Within two three days several parcels of fine Middlings 33s. 9d. of coarse do. at 31s. 3d. @ 32s. 6d. and of Pollards at 27s. 6d. @ 31s. 3d. according to quality, have been sold for the Quebec and country consumption.

Provisions have not been much in demand during the past week, and prices are less firm. We have no alteration to notice except in Prime Mess Pork which has sustained a reduction, and may now be quoted at 90s. @ 92s. 6d. per bbl. Other sorts remain at our previous quotations.  
**Money**—We have not heard of any sales of Exchange of any consequence, Montreal Bank Shares have advanced from 100 @ 103 @ 104.
