The lead mine, Galena, on Mr. E. Wrights property, on being examined by a competent mineralogist, shows a percentage of from 2 and a-half to 3 per cent of silver. Some time ago Mr. Wright had this bed tested, though not thoroughly, and he was then assured of a large percentage of silver, but would hardly believe it. On the strength of this last investigation he has decided to develop the mine. The mineralogist says the percentage is greater than that at Silver Island, Lake Superior.

The first shipment of thoroughbred stock to British Columbia left Broeklan on Thursday-week for the long Journey. They are for Mr. James Steele, who resides in that Province, and, at the direction of his brothers, the purchases have been made by Messrs J. J. Davidson and John Dryden. They include cattle, sheep, and pigs. They go to California via the Central Pacific, and thence to Brititish Columbia by steamer, and are in charge of a British Columbian.

Victoria. B. C., has a young giant in the person of a youth named Hutchinson, 20 years of age, who stands six feet and nine and three-quarter inches, and weighs two hundred pounds.
