

to arise to the circulation of such **Metallic Currency** in the **Province**, at the rate specified in the **Order in Council**—a **Provincial Statute** having assigned a less value to **British Silver Money**.

In these several Documents the measure is so fully and clearly stated, that **His Excellency** has only to recommend to the **Assembly**, to make such **Legislative Enactments** as are necessary to give effect to the intentions of **His Majesty's Government**, by ensuring the general use of this **Money** as a circulating medium in the **Province**.

Mr. Secretary George also delivered to the **House**, by **His Excellency's Command**, the several **Papers** referred to in the foregoing **Message**; and thereupon,

Ordered, That the **Message** and **Papers** do lie on the **Table**, to be perused by the **Members** of the **House**.

Mr. Fairbanks, pursuant to leave given, presented a **Bill** for exempting certain **Military Officers** from local **Taxes**, and the same was read a first time.

Resolved, That the **Bill** be read a second time.

Then the **House** adjourned until **To-morrow**, at **Twelve** of the **Clock**.

Ordered, That **Mr. Young**, **Mr. Fraser**, **Mr. Hartshorne**, **Mr. Lawson** and **Mr. J. R. DeWolf**, be a **Committee** agreeably to the foregoing **Resolution**.

Ordered, That the foregoing **Resolution** be sent to **His Majesty's Council**, for concurrence.

A **Bill** for exempting certain **Military Officers** from local **Taxes**, was read a second time.

Resolved, That the **Bill** be committed to a **Committee** of the whole **House**.

Then the **House** adjourned until **To-morrow**, at **Twelve** of the **Clock**.
