to arise to the circulation of such Metallic Currency in the Province, at the rate specified in the Order in Council—a Provincial Statute having assigned a less value to British Silver Money.

In these several Documents the measure is so fully and clearly stated, that His Excellency has only to recommend to the Assembly, to make such Legislative Enactments as are necessary to give effect to the intentions of His Majesty's Government, by ensuring the general use of this Money as a circulating medium in the Province.

Mr. Secretary George also delivered to the House, by His Excellency's Command, the several
