Ordered, That the Hon. Mr. Palmer, Mr. Longworth, and the Hon. J. S. Macdonald be a Committee, to prepare and bring in a Bill, pursuant to the second of the above reported Resolutions.

The Hon. Mr. Palmer moved, that the following Address to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor do now pass:

To His Excellency Sir H. V. HUNTLEY, Knight, Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Her Majesty's Island Prince Edward, and the Territories thereunto belonging, Chancellor, Vice Admiral, and Ordinary of the same, &c. &c. &c.

May it please your Excellency;

The House of Assembly being about to provide for the expense of erecting the proposed Light House on Point Prim, in Queen's County, humbly request, that your Excellency will be pleased to cause to be procured separate estimates of the expense of erecting the said Light House, either of brick or of the stone of this Island, and to cause such estimates to be laid before this House at some convenient period before the close of the present Session.
