MARKET REPORTS

CHICAGO, Sept. 8.—Corn today rose to a new high price for the season in the December option and narrowly missed a new high level in other futures. Inadequacy of yield from drought and heat was largely responsible. The close, the year, showed an advance of 3/8c to 1 1/2c net. Other leading cereals, too, made gains—wheat, 1/2c to 3/4c to 3/4c, and oats 1/4c to 1/2c. In provisions, the outcome varied from 1/2c decline to 17 1/2c advance. The Liverpool market closed 1/4c to 1/2c lower on wheat, and 1/4c lower on corn.

WEST LAND REGULATIONS

A NY PERSON who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of available land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must be a person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agent of the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any certain date.

Notice—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may reside upon one mile of his homestead on a farm of 160 acres. The homesteader must reside upon in each of six or pre-emption six months in each of three years, and all years of residence including the time required to clear, homestead, survey and cultivate 10 acres extra.

A homesteader who has obtained his homestead right, and cannot obtain his homestead right, may purchase a homestead in certain districts for \$500 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, and all years of residence including the time required to clear, homestead, survey and cultivate 10 acres extra.
