Income War Tax Forms Must Be Filed Before March 31st. It was inevitable that an income war tax law should have been placed on the statute books. The demands made upon Canada, as one of the free nations of the world, engaged in the life or death battle with the forces of barbarism, and the necessity of distributing the burden as equitably as possible, made the imposition of a tax, based on ability to pay, merely a matter of time.

REGULATE PRICES

Winnipeg, March 17.—Frank C. Fowler, secretary of the Northwest Grain Dealers Association, in a letter to the date of March 15, has notified all members of the association to advise their agents to use prices based on two cents per hundred advance in freight rates on oats, flax and barley. It is understood that the advanced freight on wheat does not come into effect until June 1.

HONORED DEAD LEADER

Montreal, March 17.—St. Patrick's Day parade, which usually is one of the big events of the year in Montreal, was not held yesterday out of respect to the memory of John Redmond. A solemn high mass was held in St. Patrick's church with Archbishop Bruchési presiding at the altar. A relic of St. Patrick was exposed for the veneration of the devotees.

WORKMAN DROWNED

Halifax, March 17.—Thos. Smith of Sarnia, an employee of the Reid Wrecking Company, was drowned at an early hour yesterday morning. He was on night duty, and was coming from the ship to the shore when he fell into the harbor. He called loudly for help. A watchman on the wharf heard him and as quickly as possible threw him a rope. Smith, evidently chilled by the icy water and helpless, moaned: "I can't, I can't," and sank. His body was recovered yesterday afternoon.

STENOGRAPHERS OF CANADIAN ROYAL WEER LAND REGULATORS

The sole head of a family, or any man over 35 years of age, who was at the time of the present war, a British subject or a subject of an allied neutral country, and who has been a resident in Canada since Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon cultivation of a land is a home of three years.

BLIZZARD IN NFD.

St. Johns, Nfld. March 18.—The worst blizzard Newfoundland has experienced in 50 years for the last three days has completely blocked railroad and coastwise steamer traffic. Only one death, that of a truck man in this city, who perished with his horse, while on his way home last night, had been reported to-day as a result of the storm, although much suffering was caused. The crew of the Fish-taden schooner, Prospero, which grounded near Cape Race, after leaving here for Europe, was brought back last night. A number of vessels moored for the winter were driven to sea and it was feared that some shipping disaster might be reported as means of communication were restored. Fears for the sealing steamers which set out last week were allayed, however, by a wireless message that all were safe. The blizzard began to subside to-day.

SUB OFFICER ARRESTED

Athens, March 17.—Two Greek officers, who were landed on the west coast of the Peloponnese by a German submarine, have been arrested. They are said to have been sent by former King Constantine to obtain information on the state of the kingdom, and to have received instructions personally from the former ruler.
