Pense defeated Balgonie at football on Monday. The game which was played at Pense resulted in a score of 2-1 in favor of Pense.

Only one man voted against the bylaw to raise by debenture sale funds for a collegiate institute in Moose Jaw. The vote was taken on Tuesday.

The Grey baseball team of Regina were in Craik on Monday for a game but got defeated by the northern boys, the score being 7-0 in favor of Craik.

Harold Nelson and his company will be in Regina on Thursday and Friday nights of this week and will produce "Richelleu" and "Graustark."

Chief Justice Wetmore left last Saturday for Fredericton, N.B. where the university of that province will confer on him the honorary degree of LL.D. on May 28th.

The Regina Fair board has the prize list for the summer fair compiled and it will be in the hands of the printer in a day or two, and it is expected to be issued in ten days.

The provincial government is calling for tenders for the proposed parliament buildings. Tenders must put up a marked cheque for \$100,000. To inspect the plans and specifications contractors must pay \$100.

The first cricket match of the season played between the R.N.W.M.P. and the city took place on Monday, the city players getting the worst of it. The players were entertained at a smoking concert at the barracks in the evening.

E. Meadows and Geo. Mollard left last week for Waterloo, a new townsite on the G.T.P. to secure lots and erect a building for the Waterloo Trading Co., of which firm they are chief shareholders. They expect to be ready for business in a couple of months.

The town of Moosomin to encourage the planting of trees within the town limits has passed a bylaw whereby provision is made for the allowance of fifty cents per tree for every tree planted and kept in a healthy condition, on the tax account of the replayer who plants them in front of his property.

A meeting of the board of governors of the University of Saskatchewan, was held in the City last Thursday. Mr. A. F. Angus, of Regina, was selected chairman of the board and D. P. McCall, secretary. Steps are being taken to secure a president and that was practically the only question discussed at the meeting.

Six cars and caboose of the east-bound way freight were derailed at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon one mile east of McTaggart. The exact cause of the accident is not known, the bed is soft from recent rains and the train was going fast. One man was slightly hurt. The wrecking train from Moose Jaw soon arrived and the derailed cars rolled away, and a new track laid around the wreck. By eight o'clock the line was all clear.—Yellow Grass Journal.

D. J. Wylie, M.L.A. spent Victoria Day at Maple Creek.

The Knights of Columbus had a great day in Regina on Monday last. A class of thirty-five candidates were initiated into the mysteries of the three degrees of the order. The work commenced at eleven o'clock in the morning. In the evening the local council entertained the visitors, who were present from points between Edmonton and Winnipeg to a banquet at the King's hotel. Among those present from outside points were P. J. Nolan, territorial deputy of Calgary, and Territorial Deputy T. E. Deegan of Winnipeg.

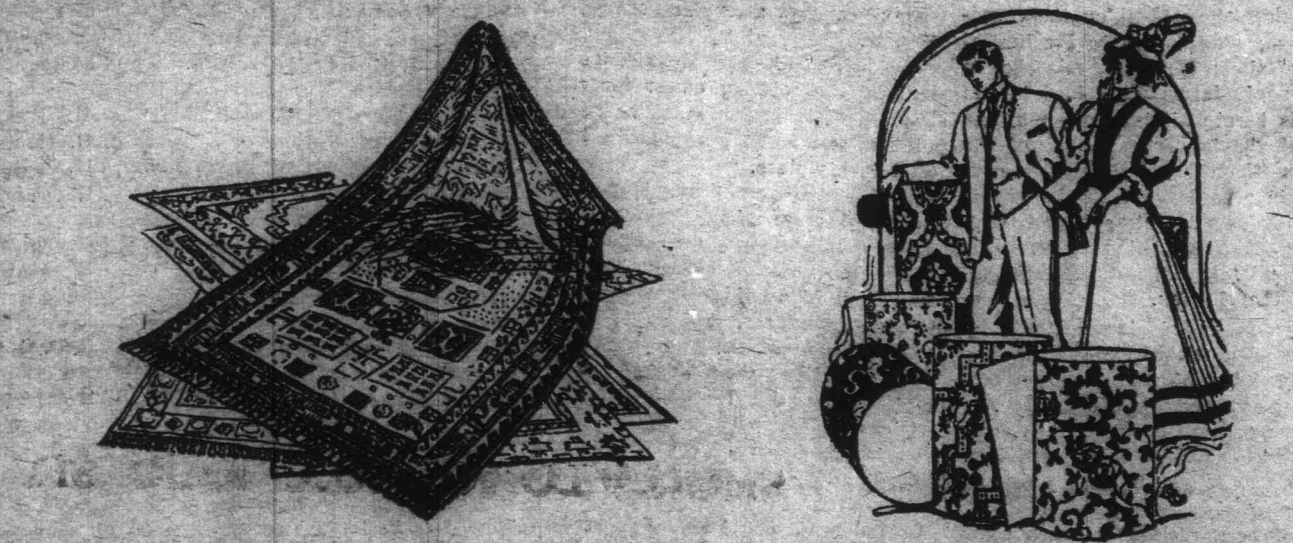

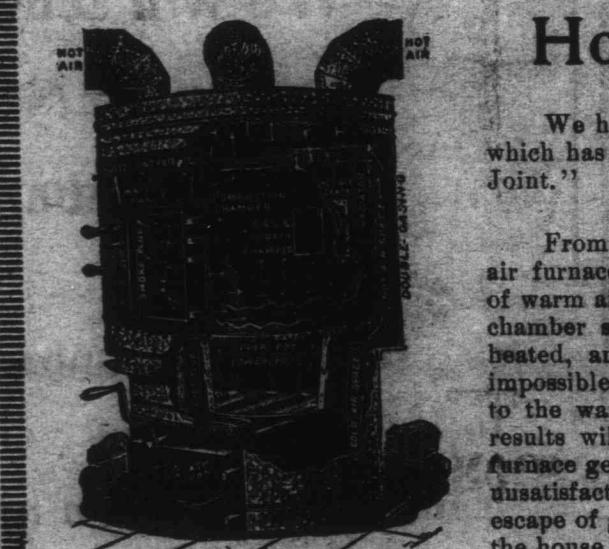
