Mr. Hobson said his company could not entertain the city's request that it fill in Lotridge's inlet, because it sold all the slag to Doolittle & Wilcox.

The committee decided to award the tender for filling in the inlet at 37 1/2 cents a yard.

The city will take no action in the request to have Slater street opened through Ald. McLaren and Allan ward, on Donald Smith, a property owner, who holds the key to the situation, and who refused to give any of his land.

Secretary Brennan pointed out that there was a two-foot reserve there, so that, although two streets would be within two feet of each other there would be practically no street. The committee will take no action.
