A COLORED sister in the Convent of St. Francis, Baltimore, is said to be 107 years of age. She was in the prime of life when she joined the Sisters of Providence sixty years ago.

The Street railway system of Toronto has of late been tied up in consequence of a strike. The men want higher wages which the company refuse to pay.

The death is announced from Vienna of Francis Pech, one of the nurses who attended the late Herr Barjsh, of Professor Nothnagel's pathological laboratory, the victim of the outbreak of bubonic plague in Vienna.

A SAN FRANCISCO despatch says the Duchesse Anne from Hong Kong, a French barque, was ordered to be quarantined owing to bubonic plague having broken out on board amongst the crew of Captain Derary and one of the sailors.

Two seamen from the training ship Antigonish of Charlottetown, England, were killed and two others seriously wounded by the Canadian Pacific train, carrying marines from Halifax to the Pacific coast, jumping the track near Fort William, Ontario.

THERE will be a grand Military demonstration at Quebec on the arrival of the 12th Inst. of Lord Minto, new Governor-general of Canada, and Lady Minto. All of the local corps are to be ordered out and the Honours will form an escort for the distinguished personages.

THE greatest freshet known for years in France took place on the night of the 29th ult. The Salmon River overflowed and the water is six feet deep on the marshes. Low parts of the town are flooded. The new Park street extension across the marsh is submerged and the bridge now under construction is badly damaged.

REV. DR. MORRISON returned on Monday evening from his vacation to the Upper Provinces. On Thursday last he preached in the Ursuline Convent at Three Rivers, P. Q., on the occasion of the ceremony of taking the veil. It is said to be the first English sermon preached by a Catholic priest in that city.

Col. George E. Waring, C. E., of New York, who was the engineer upon whose plans the Charlottetown Sewerage Works are constructed, died at his home on Saturday last, of yellow fever and black vomit. He was one of the United States Commissioners to Havana, regarding sanitary matters, and is said to have contracted the disease of which he died.

OWING to hurried orders from the British Admiralty the dockyard hands and all the city shipwrights at Dover had been working night and day on the warships. At Esquimaux, B. C., there is also great excitement. The Amphion, the fastest cruiser of the station will sail on Tuesday for Comox to meet her sister ship Phosion, and the two will go from there to the French settlement Sagita.

EXTRAVAGANT preparations are being made by the British Government at Dover, port, the site of the largest arsenal in Great Britain, and two thirds of the finest dockyards in the world. An immense squadron is assembling there to see, it is thought, sent to Gibraltar. The Collops, a third-class cruiser, which was on her way to Canada, has unexpectedly returned to Plymouth. Two hundred thousand tons of coal have been ordered.

PROVINCIAL Secretary (1898) of the Ontario Government who was defeated at the general election about eight months ago, was elected the other day in East Wellington, made known by the death of a Government supporter. He remained in the Government all this time and drew his pay as a minister of the Crown, without a seat in the House. These Ontario Gists do extraordinary things.
