

SHELDON, MONTREAL'S FINANCIAL WIZARD, SENTENCED TO FIVE YEARS

Stock Market Operator Who Robbed His Clients Found Guilty. HIS GAME KNOWN AS "BLIND POOL."

Final Chapter in Sensational Case in City of Montreal.

Montreal, June 18.—"Guilty," was the verdict rendered today in the case of C. D. Sheldon, charged with appropriating to his own use funds given him by various clients for investment. A sentence of five years in the penitentiary was given immediately. The judgment was rendered by Judge Lussier, who sat as trial judge in this case in the Court of Sessions. This was the particular charge on which judgment was rendered.

INQUIRY IS CONTINUED

Conciliation Board in Men's Dispute is at Frank. Frank Alberta, June 14.—Last night the open session of the inquiry being carried on before the conciliation board was taken up with the examination of Mr. Shone, superintendent of the Canada Consolidated company, Geo. Nicola, secretary of the Frank local union, and William Carruthers, the miner, who had been on the stand in the secret session. The evidence of these men was along the same lines as former evidence bearing upon conditions peculiar to the locality. No evidence as to wages or other matters pertaining to cost of production was made public. The session this morning was taken up with the presentation of the statement of wages, etc., of the West Canadian Colliers. This statement was of the same character as those from the other mines, being the average of the ten highest paid men had the ten lowest.

Baking Companies Merge. New York, June 14.—Twenty-one big baking companies in cities dotting the east and south from Boston to St. Louis and New Orleans, threw in their towels today, merging into one under the name of the General Baking company, with a total capital of \$20,000,000 in stock and \$5,000,000 in bonds. The chain of bakeries will be operated in 15 cities.

Vancouver Business Men Urge B. C. Government To Build Railway to Peace River Country.

Vancouver, June 14.—A public meeting of business men in the board of trade rooms here tonight unanimously decided to urge the provincial government to assist the proposal for the construction of a railway from Vancouver north to Fort McLeod, ending in the Peace River country. Secret Alliance Against Reciprocity Agreement

American Trusts and Canadian Corporate Interests Seek to Defeat Agreement by Any Foul Means at Hand—People Are For It.

Ottawa, June 14.—That the reciprocity agreement will be adopted by the United States senate is now reasonably certain, it has passed the senate committee, and while the amendment of Mr. Root has been added by that committee, it in no way affects the Canadian position, even if, which seems doubtful, it is permitted to remain when the agreement is finally passed upon. The chief element of doubt was as to the effect on the sensibility of the agitation of the National Grange against reciprocity. The hostility of the Grangers first developed in March, gathered strength in April and in May the senate was bombarded with petitions and deputations painting in lurid colors the disaster to United States farmers which would result from opening the tariff doors to the products of the Canadian farmers. The American senate, which has been all along regarded as lukewarm, seemed under strong pressure to protect the agricultural interests of their constituents. The anti-reciprocity movement, according to the representations made, "all the pockets of the Western Canadian farmers."

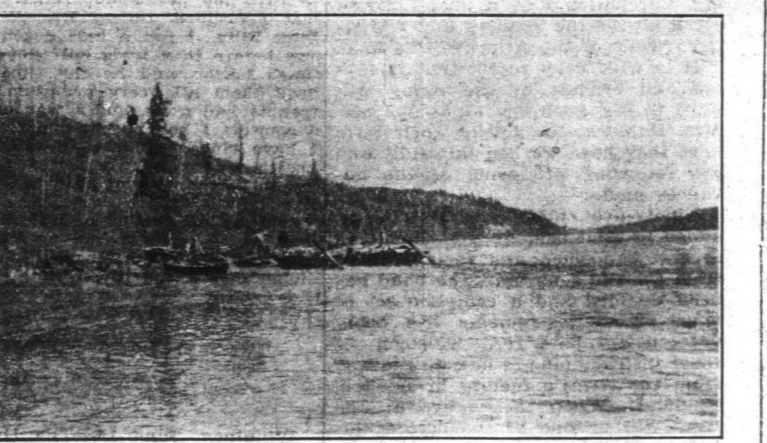

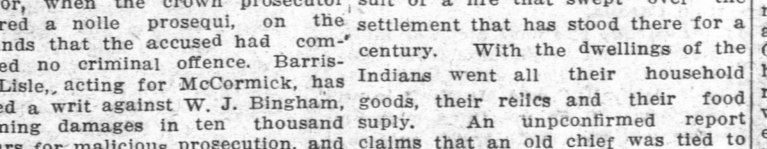
