Novel Wire Laying.

The stringing of telephone wire ordinarilly a quite prosaic matter that rarely arouses more than passing interest in the spectator. In British land, however, the operation is sometimes a rather thrilling process. In that it frequently is necessary to install telephones temporarily at points where there are no permanent facilties, and in such cases, one method employed is to lay the insulated wires directly over the ground by means of specially designed apparatus which is attached to the sadle of a horse, and which automatically unwinds the wire as the horse gallops. Recently a Punjab horseman established a record by laying a line over two miles long in seven minutes.

Coal Vein is Found **Below College Campus**
