PUBLIC NOTICE.

The attention of the Public is
 called to the following Section
 of the St. John's Municipal Act:
 Section 253: Every person who shall
 without just cause or excuse refuse
 to permit the appraisers to enter and
 inspect the premises occupied by him
 for the purpose of assessing the value
 thereof, or who shall refuse to give
 correct information, or shall
 knowingly give them false information
 in regard to his ownership of any
 property, or to the rent which he de-
 mands therefrom or pays therefor, or
 the cost of such property, or to his
 ability to the Poll Tax, whether as
 his age, length of residence in the
 City, non-liability to the City Tax, or
 otherwise, or who shall in any way
 impede or attempt to impede the said
 appraisers in the discharge of their
 duties under this Act shall upon con-
 viction be liable to pay to the City a
 fine of not more than twenty dollars,
 and shall, in default of payment, be
 liable to imprisonment for a period
 not exceeding thirty days.
