## SHOT AND RAN.

**Mysterious Affair in Toronto—A Young**  
Man Mortally Wounded.

TORONTO, Oct. 7.—Frank B. Westwood,  
aged 18, son of Benjamin Westwood, living  
at 28 Jamieson street, Parkdale, was the  
victim of a mysterious shooting accident  
last night, and is in a critical condition.  
At 10:45 o'clock he went to open the door  
in answer to a ring. As he did so a man  
standing in the doorway fired point blank  
at his breast and ran away. Young West-  
wood fell to the floor with a scream. The  
bullet had entered under the seventh rib  
and descended into the bowels. No trace  
of the assailant has been found.

**Interesting Copyright Case.**

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Oct. 7.—Judge  
Acheson, of the United States Circuit  
Court, heard argument yesterday on de-  
mander to the bill of complaint of the  
novelist H. Rider Haggard and the publish-  
ing firm of Longmans, Green & Co., of  
New York, against the Waverley Company,  
of New York, for an alleged infringement  
by the latter of the copyright of Haggard's  
novel "Nady, the Lily." This is the first  
case arising under the new international  
copyright law passed in 1890 and involves  
the constitutionality of the act.

**A Train Burned.**

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., Oct. 7.—A special  
from Bristol says: This afternoon train  
No. 1 from New York on the Southern  
Railway jumped the track near Bristol.  
The engine fell across the track and the  
express and mail cars caught fire. The  
flames consumed the entire train of eight  
coaches with the exception of the last car,  
a Pullman sleeper, which was cut loose and  
backed from the train. Ten persons were  
injured. Samuel Smith, engineer, will  
probably die.
