SEALED TENDERS addressed to the undersigned, and intended for improvements at Upper Entrance of Rapide Plat Canal, will be received at this office until 12 o'clock on Saturday, the 24th day of September, 1901, for the work connected with the widening, straightening and deepening of the Upper Entrance of the Rapide Plat Canal. Plans and specifications of the work can be seen on and after the 14th day of September, 1901, at the office of the Chief Engineer of the Department of Railways and Canals, Ottawa, and at the Engineer's office, at Cornwall. Printed forms of tender can also be obtained at the places mentioned.

In the case of firms there must be attached to the tender the actual signatures of the full name, the nature of the occupation and residence of each member of the same, and further, an accepted bank check for the sum of \$7.50, must accompany the tender. This accepted bank check must be deposited over to the Minister of Railways and Canals, and will be forfeited if the party tendering declines entering into contract for the work at the rate and upon the terms stated in the offer submitted. The accepted bank check thus sent in will be returned to the respective parties whose tenders are not accepted.

The department does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender.

Contractors are specially notified that the conditions requiring the works to be wholly completed by the 30th day of November, A.D. 1901, will be rigidly enforced, and any penalties for delay exacted.

METEOROLOGICAL

Toronto, Sept. 13-8 p.m.—The weather has been generally fine in Canada today, but the rapid advance of a disturbance from the North Pacific conditions in the Territories and Manitoba. The great storm was centered this morning near St. John's, Newfoundland, the barometer at St. John's reading 28.78 inches reduced to sea level. Minimum and maximum temperatures: Victoria, 50-62; Calgary, 30-60; Qu'Appelle, 23-58; Winnipeg, 50-64; Port Arthur, 48-62; Parry Sound, 52-70; Toronto, 52-75; Ottawa, 50-66; Montreal, 52-69; Quebec, 48-58; Halifax, 45-58.

Local temperatures.—The highest and lowest readings of the thermometer at the observatory here yesterday were: Highest, 77; lowest, 46°. Today (Friday) the sun rose at 5:55 a.m., and sets at 6:32 p.m. The moon rises at 9:59 p.m., and sets at 12:34 a.m.

RETURNING HOME
