Requested by Sultan's Ambassador to Washington-Americans in Great Peril.

Sayville, L. I., Aug. 31.-Alarmed at the critical condition of Americanman's devotion to outdoor sports Turkish relations, Chekib Bey, the Porte's envoy to the United States, is hastening to Washington for a conference with Secretary Hay. The minister hurriedly left his summer legation here Saturday night and because of the gravity of the situation he will ask Secretary Hay to receive him immediately. The conference will probably take place at Mr. Hay's house in

The dispatch of the American warships to Turkish waters is a source of the greatest anxiety to the minister.
